- Advent means "coming or arrival," and the reason for the season is anticipation and preparation for the birth of the Christ child. These hangings are intended to create a backdrop for the season of expectation and longing for a light in the darkness and the coming of the Cosmic Christ.
- The imagery includes a star shining through the night sky illuminating the dark and vast wilderness.
- The liturgical color for advent is serum blue. Shades of blue traditionally can symbolize royalty, the coming of the King, hope, the night sky before the dawn, the sea before creation, and Mary. The gestural application and transparent quality of the paint indicate the depth of the vast darkness of Advent as we wait with expectation and longing for the birth of the savior.
