



Following the 10:00am service on July 21, the family of J. David Hunter invites you to join them in the C. E. Foyer.

Pastor John Lentz will lead the dedication of this area in memory of J. David Hunter, 1940-2020.

David was a member of Forest Hill Church, Presbyterian, for 67 years. As a young boy, he and his sister Anne Jenkins were present at the laying of the foundation stone of the church building.

David and his beloved first wife Joyce (deceased June 16, 1996) raised their three daughters at the church.

David was an Elder and a Trustee. He served on the ministries of Stewardship, Justice and Mission, Personnel, Adult Education, Budget, Pastor Nominating and Associate Pastor Nominating.



David was chair of the committee that selected the Casavant organ for the sanctuary and chair of the Endowment Committee.

He also served on the Accessibility Committee and the Sacred Space Committee.

His imprint is on every church building project for forty years, 1980 to 2020.

During his latter years, David served as Building Manager, giving his professional gifts to the service of the church.

David was a Servant Leader of his beloved Forest Hill Church.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Vision Statement of Session

By 2027, Session will courageously embrace the transition by being:

Spiritually led, more diverse, fully prepared to serve, living into individual gifts, connecting with and across ministries, and communicating openly and actively with congregants, as a Matthew 25 Church and Beloved Community.

The Session of Forest Hill Church met on May 5, May 22, and May 26, 2024. Pastor John Lentz was the Moderator for each of the meetings.

<u>May 5, 2024</u>

On Sunday, May 5, 2024, Session met in a special meeting. The sole purpose of the meeting was to discuss and vote on the formation of the Transitional Pastor Search Committee (TPSC).

Pastor Lentz reported that the following congregants agreed to serve on the TPSC: Marcie Denton, Nicole Lawrence, Ron Zimmerman, Dick Obermanns and Adam Majot. One other person had been invited and was still discerning a response. He also stated that additional committee members could be considered at a later date, if suggestions are provided.

Session discussed the committee formation and then voted to approve the members unanimously.

May 22, 2024

The Stated Session Meeting on May 22 was called to order by Pastor Lentz and opened with prayer. Pastor Lentz led all in reading the Vision Statement developed by Session. He then led a spiritual conversation focused on the period of pastoral transition. He encouraged elders to think about and share their concerns, aspirations, questions and hopes for the future of the church as he prepares to retire and the church seeks new pastoral leadership.

Session unanimously approved the following baptisms:

- June 9, 2024 Madelaine Matej MacQueen; Eleanor and Margaret Matej MacQueen, daughters of Madelaine and James Matej MacQueen;
- July 21, 2024 Persephone Ezell, daughter of Em Laudeman Ezell and Jake Ezell

Two people requested to be removed from the membership roll: Zelma Sharp and Suzanne Marcy. Session approved these requests, unanimously.

The Financial Report dated April 30, 2024 as well as a brief update from the Financial Committee were both received.

Immigration Task Force (ITF) – ITF reported the intention to continue to make the apartment in the Education Wing available for Sanctuary or short-term residence for immigrants and refugees. There is an ongoing need for such space. They asked that Session approve the continued use of this space in this manner. Session approved the continued use of this space unanimously, pending legal and liability review.

Creating Racial Equity (CRE) Audit – Each ministry provided a summary of how they have responded to the recommendations of the CRE Audit. Initial work includes updating, reflecting on and being intentional about mission statements, holding each other accountable, improving the church website to better reflect the diversity of the church, working toward vendor diversity goals, connecting with grant recipients through a Justice Ministry luncheon, examining the equity implications of use of Justice grants, paying attention to Deacon Care groups to have an equitable mix of people by gender, age and race, ensuring the building and grounds support the intentions for equity and encouraging people of color to become more involved in leadership roles.

Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) – Ministries have been reflecting on the results of the CAT. Some have set goals and are planning programming to be responsive to the results, including: reaching out to young adult congregants, planning congregational small groups to explore how congregants are feeling/thinking about the pastoral transition and improved relationship-building.

Endowment Strategic Priorities – Session discussed the strategic priorities and opportunities for using the Endowment funds that are available for 2024. After a lengthy and thoughtful discussion, the following uses were approved, unanimously:

This list will be submitted to the Endowment Committee for review and final approval.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Lentz talked about the plans for worship and preaching in August, after his final sermon. He also stated that in the event that a transitional pastor has not been contracted as soon as is needed then, upon approval by session, the Presbytery of the Western Reserve (PWR) will provide a short term pastor to the church until a transitional pastor is under contract with session.

May 26, 2024

On Sunday, May 26, 2024, session met for a

special meeting. The sole purpose of this special meeting was to examine and receive James Matej MacQueen and Madelaine Matej MacQueen who both desired to become members of Forest Hill Church, Presbyterian.

Pastor Lentz invited all present to introduce themselves and share what encouraged them to join and continue to be at the church. James and Madelaine affirmed their desire to become members. They were examined and joyfully received into membership by a unanimous vote of session.

TRANSITIONAL PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE

The Transitional Pastor Search Committee (TPSC) would like to share an update of our work.

Our Objective:

The work of this committee is to seek a transitional (interim) pastor for Forest Hill Church (FHC) who will guide us in the process of choosing a new installed pastor after John Lentz retires. We serve as an arm of Session.

Our Task List:

- 1. Use information from listening sessions, our own church documents, and examples of search documents from other churches to form a Position Description that includes a description of our church, as well as a description of what we seek in a transitional pastor.
- 2. Share the Position Description with the FHC Personnel Committee.
- 3. Make any changes to the Position Description based on feedback from the Personnel Committee.
- 4. Share the Position Description with the Session of Forest Hill Church.
- 5. Once the Session approves the Position Description, it will be sent to the Committee on Ministry (COM) of the Presbytery of the Western Reserve.
- 6. After approval from the COM, we will begin making prospective Transitional Pastor candidates aware of the position.
- 7. The candidates will be interviewed by the TPSC, which will select a candidate to recommend to the Session. Following

approval by the Presbytery's COM, the Session will meet with that candidate and, given Session's approval, draw up a contract with the candidate which includes the responsibilities of the position and the terms of employment.

As of the June 20 deadline for submissions to the Tower, the TPSC has completed Step Two. Please stay tuned to the "Week Ahead" emails and church announcements for more current updates.

Our Members:

The members (recruited by the Nominating Committee) are Marcie Denton, Nicole Lawrence, Adam Majot, Dick Obermanns, and Ron Zimmerman. We chose Ron Zimmerman and Adam Majot to be our co-chairs.

We are working under the guidance of Arvid Whitmore, who represents the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery of the Western Reserve.

GCC Youth Bindover Initiative Update

GCC leaders and representatives from partner organizations were heartened that the Ohio Public Defender Commission stated at its June 14th public hearing that it is investigating Cuyahoga County's system for appointing lawyers in juvenile court, and that the commission agrees it can withhold funds if it finds the County in violation of state policy. GCC held a prayer vigil prior to the hearing in downtown Cleveland. Then, several leaders from GCC and partner organizations testified at the hearing with numerous GCC leaders, including 15 Forest Hill Church members, in attendance.

Perspectives on Climate Change

Twenty years ago, "climate change" had barely entered our language. Sure there were "God-made natural disasters", a

few hurricanes, river floods, an isolated forest fire here and there, vague concerns about the melting ice-caps and glaciers, and polar bears not finding enough to eat... but minimal concern that mankind had anything to do with these issues. Al Gore was considered something of a crackpot.

My, how the attitudes and concerns have changed in the past two decades. Few would now not acknowledge that the rampant frequency and severity of these so-called "natural disasters" are exacerbated by our use of fossil fuels, destruction of forests and wetlands, destruction of inhabitable and agriculturally suitable land and other actions—and the ultimate angst of rise in greenhouse gas emissions resulting in increased temperatures.

So intellectually, we're largely in agreement that such violent "natural disasters" that we are experiencing are indeed real, and manmade enhanced.

It can be argued that as individuals, while we try, we cannot alter the influence of climate change without global cooperation between governments, industries, and peoples.

But what do we really feel about climate change as it affects our personal lives, our

future and our kin, the earth's resources, our air and water, food, and how it affects peoples and all other living things all over the world...

Let us contemplate this preceding paragraph during the summer months, and we will conduct a special discussion session early in the fall to allow us to really express our feelings as a Christian community.
