WORDS FROM THE REV. CAROL WEDELL



By now you are probably aware that I have been asked to serve as “Gap” pastor. This means that I’m filling the gap between John and whoever is called to serve as our Transitional Pastor. While the committee diligently searches for that person, I will be preaching most Sundays, be available for pastoral concerns, handle baptisms, weddings and funerals as they arise, moderate both staff and Session meetings, and, in general, provide pastoral leadership during this in-between time. I will not ordinarily attend ministry meetings or most other small groups, though I am available for consultation. My role is to keep things going, not to make big changes. Those, if they come, will be driven by the Transitional Pastor and/or the Session. Because of the part-time, temporary nature of my position, I will primarily be working from home, Monday-Thursday, approximately 11-4:30. I will, however, be available by email (pastorwedell@fhcpresb.org) or phone (216-470-0152) as needed. Please let me know about pastoral concerns. I am so grateful for this opportunity to serve!

That’s what I’m doing during this time of uncertainty. I have been thrilled to see

countless folks “step up” to take on a wide variety of responsibilities, all of which keep the church humming along. My hope for our future is largely because of you – the depth and breadth of dedicated, talented folks who are willing to share your time and abilities to help us move forward faithfully.

Where can you contribute? If you aren’t sure what you can do, let me make a few suggestions. First, and foremost, show up! Your presence in worship speaks volumes to everyone else. Simply being present on Sunday mornings declares that Forest Hill is alive and well and looking for ways to follow Jesus!

Second, either continue with those smaller groups that are meaningful to you or find a new place to connect. The options are vast! If you are willing to serve on one of the Ministry teams, let the Nominating Committee know (Jeff Smith and Barb Hansen are the contacts). There are Adult Spiritual Growth groups meeting almost every day of the week, both in person and virtually. Look for their brochure or on our website to see what might fit your schedule. If you are musically inclined, consider the choir or bell choir. If you love children, see Amy about how you can support our growing group of young ones. The stream team needs help and will train anyone willing to learn. Contact Kurt Haas or catch one of the folks in the balcony on Sunday. If you are willing to usher, Twanda Patterson and Deborah Erwin-Nash are always looking to expand their group. And that just scratches the surface. Whatever your interest, there is, or can be, a place for you.

Chancel Choir Concert

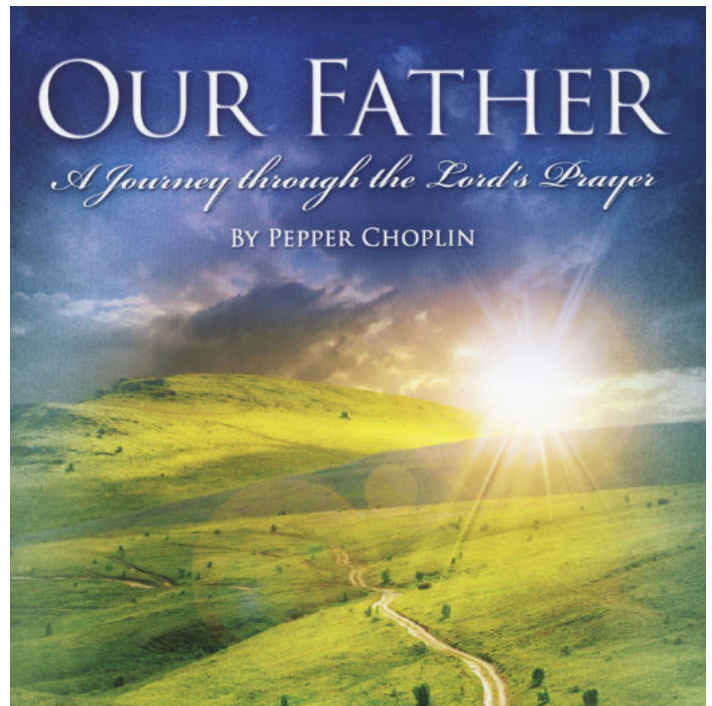
“A Journey through the Lord’s Prayer”

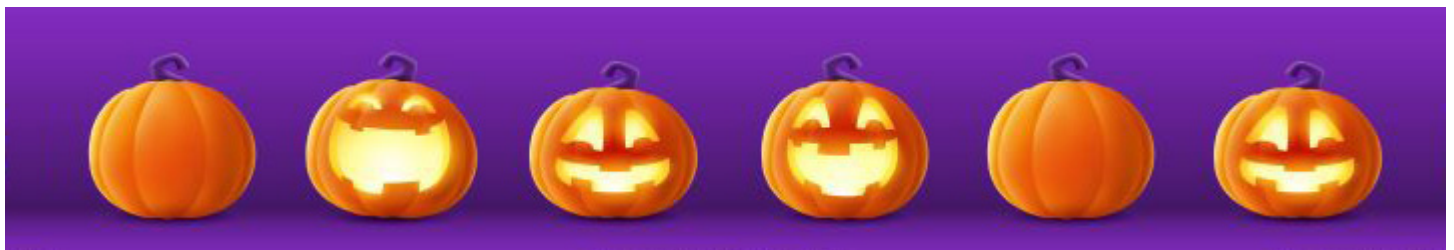




The Resonance Project

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Vision Statement of Session:

By 2027, Session will courageously embrace the transition by:

*Being spiritually led, more diverse, and more fully prepared to serve
Living into individual gifts
Connecting with and across ministries, and
Communicating openly and actively with congregants, all as a Matthew 25 Church and Beloved Community.*

The Session of Forest Hill Church met on August 28, 2024. Rev. Eileen Vizcaino was the moderator. Rev. Vizcaino was previously approved by the Committee on Ministry, Presbytery of the Western Reserve, to serve as moderator. The meeting was called to order by Rev. Vizcaino and opened with prayer.

Rev. Vizcaino invited all to join in a spiritual conversation centered on two questions: What are you excited about for the church? What is your ministry going to do in the coming year?

The Financial Report for the period ending July 21, 2024, was received, as was the Finance Committee report.

The Gap Pastor Committee reported on their work with Rev. Carol Wedell to develop a mutually agreeable job description as well as terms of compensation for the position of Gap Pastor. The Committee moved that Rev. Wedell be offered the position. Session examined Rev. Wedell and then approved the offer to Rev. Wedell, which she accepted.

The Transitional Pastor Search Committee reported on the continuing work to search

and call a Transitional Pastor. One candidate has been interviewed so far. More interviews will be scheduled in the coming weeks. The Committee is expanding their outreach via the PWR, regional networking, and considering advertising in selected publications. The Committee requested a budget of \$3,450 for the potential travel costs for in-person interviews. Session approved this budget expense.

Melanie Alban reported on the ongoing project to revise and update (or create new) church policies for the Corporation, church, ministries, committees, Personnel, Family, Youth and Children, Anti-Racism, Sexual Misconduct and other vital areas.

The Nominating Committee reported on the ongoing work to discern, seek and call people to fill leadership positions in 2025 for ministry elders, elected leaders and the Nominating Committee. They also are seeking people to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee.

Ministry Actions

Worship reported that QinYing Tan and Irwin Shung are developing a concert series, The Resonance Project, which will take place at FHC over several months, starting in September. The mission is to connect modern audiences with the worlds and perspectives of gifted composers who are not often celebrated in the mainstream.

Stewardship reported on a creative approach to setting the goal for the upcoming Stewardship Campaign. They proposed to set a goal based on number of pledges received rather than a dollar amount. Session approved this approach. Details will be provided to congregants in the coming months.

Deacons reported that they will develop a

different approach to refreshments on Sunday mornings. Doughnuts will no longer be served. More diverse options will be offered. They will offer thanks to Chuck Sprague who has faithfully provided doughnuts every Sunday, for 30 years. They also reported on plans for the Fall Festival.

Church Growth reported on the Name Tag Campaign.

Justice reported their interest in working with others on creative ideas for projects. They also initiated a discussion of funding for the Racial Repair and Reparations Committee. Earlier this year Session agreed to provide annual funding for this work. In 2024 that funding was in the form of an Endowment Grant. Justice Ministry agreed to include a line item for this work in their 2025 budget. The ministry then reported the recent passing of Eddie Canales, founder and director of the South Texas Human Rights Center. This church had built a relationship with Mr. Canales during a mission trip to the South Texas/Mexico border. The ministry made a motion to invite congregants to provide contributions directly to the Center, in memory of him. Session approved the motion.

Session offered thanks to Rev. Vizcaino for serving as moderator. The meeting of Session closed with prayer by Rev. Vizcaino.

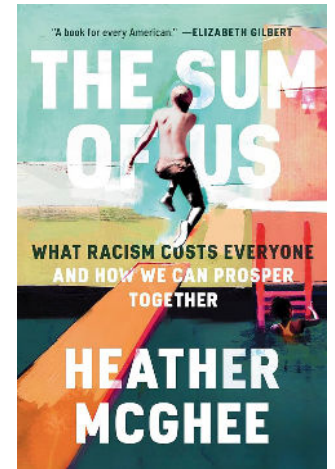

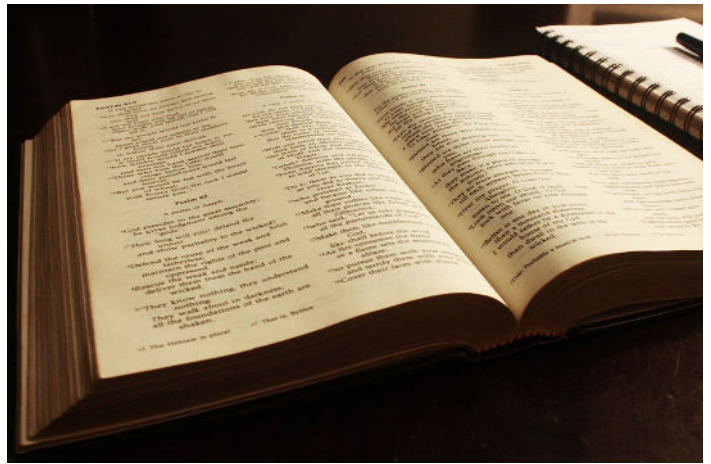

Special Offerings: Christian Perspectives from Ethiopia and Peru

Two Sunday mornings, 9:15-10:15am. Meet in person in the library. Facilitated by Dick Obermanns and Chenoa Stock.

As we prepare for World Communion Sunday on October 6, let's look at the forms of Christianity in two other continents, led by two members of our congregation who have been immersed in these countries.

September 29: Ethiopian Christianity will be described by Dick Obermanns. Ethiopia's ethnic and religious landscape is complex, with unique and fascinating features that harken back to the earliest years of the Church. We will examine issues in our contemporary relationships with Reformed-tradition Protestant/Evangelical churches in a number of other countries.

October 6: Christianity in Peru will be presented by Chenoa Stock. Chenoa will share about the various religions and spiritualities that she has encountered while serving as a Mission Co-Worker in Bolivia and Peru. She will speak to the spiritualities that existed long before the Spanish colonization of South America, and the religions that have emerged and developed since then.



STEWARDSHIP



Whenever an angel appears in the Bible, you know something special is about to happen. As a vibrant faith community, we are angels for each other in all sorts of ways. One of those ways is pooling our resources to make our church happen – the programming, supplies, staffing, building, and so many more important elements that support our ministries.

This year, we launch our annual stewardship campaign during a period of change. Angels, of course, are all about change. They announce new beginnings, are patient during transformation, and help us refine our purposes. This year, your Stewardship Ministry is making a bit of a refinement in our goal. Instead of aiming for a dollar amount, we aim to increase the number of congregants and households that make an annual pledge for 2025 – whatever the amount. We're striving to have **200 pledges**, an increase of 25 from 2024's 175 pledges. If you pledge regularly, thank you, and we hope we can count on you again this year. If you've not pledged, or perhaps it's been awhile, you can help us reach that goal by considering a pledge. Having financial commitments ahead of the budget year is so helpful for the planning of resources.

In the packet you've received in the mail from the Stewardship Ministry, you'll learn more about the work and plans of your fellow congregants as they work together on our church's many projects. Some of what we do together is tangibly visible: Youth programming, Sunday morning adult education groups, GCC meetings. Some is less concrete but no less vital: Weekly music during worship, the lasting impact of fellowship gatherings, the new importance of livestreamed services. Our physical space houses so much of how we serve each other and our community.

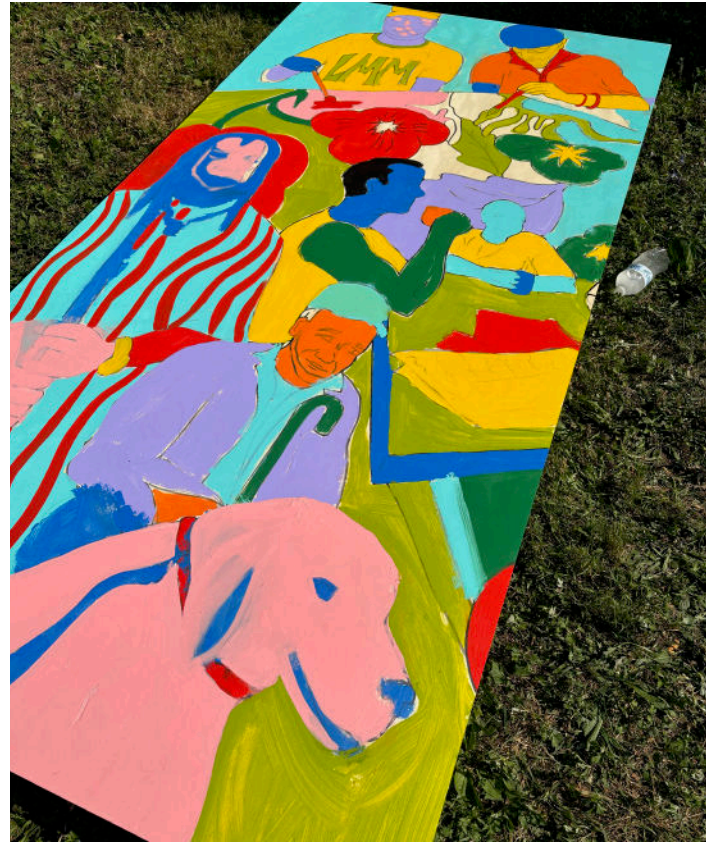

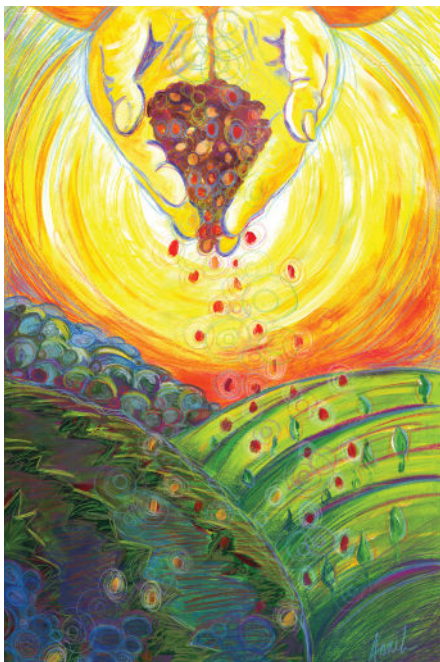
