






LOOKING AHEAD

Our Leadership, Ministries and Committees have faithfully discerned how they would like to continue to mold and shape our growth as a church. Below are some of their aspirations for the coming budgeted year.



ADULT SPIRITUAL GROWTH: Offer small group lectionary discussions and develop leaders for them

ABUNDANCE FOOD PANTRY: Continue to work with the Cleveland Food Bank to make sure we have enough food for our local community

CHURCH GROWTH: Develop an affordable marketing/advertising plan to attract new people to FHC capitalizing on our strengths such as children's education, family programming and missional outreach activities

COMMUNICATIONS: Create and implement a social media strategy; continue to strengthen digital communications such as the website and member database

DEACONS: Examine how to improve the current structure of pastoral care, continue to add more care group social activities such as pot lucks, concerts and opportunities for interactions that celebrate the Spirit's presence

EARTH CARE: Offer thoughtful leadership for the church and surrounding community on Earth Care Practices

ENDOWMENT: Elevate awareness within the congregation of the endowment and how it contributes in the current and future vitality of Forest Hill Church

FAMILY, YOUTH, CHILDREN: Expand outreach to families with resources, programs and experiences that will encourage and equip them to support the faith formation of their children/youth at home and in the life of Forest Hill Church

FINANCE: Use and improve the multi-year financial model to support Session in making decisions that continue to enhance the scope and effectiveness of the church's work while maintaining the church's long-term financial health

GREATER CLEVELAND CONGREGATIONS, GCC: Expand involvement of members and friends, particularly younger members, in the hope that more are willing to take on leadership roles in GCC, either on the FHC Core Team itself, or with issue teams for the larger GCC organization

IMMIGRATION TASK FORCE: Provide housing in the Sanctuary apartment along with compassionate logistical support for asylum seekers, both on a short and long term basis

JUSTICE: Address process to make grants more sustainable and public; have after-worship meetings with grantees so they can share experiences; increase volunteer opportunities to include short term, time-limited opportunities to accommodate busy schedules

MUSIC PROGRAM: Continue to increase interest, quality and participation in the ensembles; present at least one concert next year

NOMINATING: Continue the commitment to nominate diverse leaders who represent our congregation as a whole

PERSONNEL: Provide support to the Pastor Nominating Committee

RACIAL EQUITY BUDDIES: Continue building bridges with community individuals and groups actively engaged in antiracist and equity struggles; read and discuss five justice-centered books each year

RACIAL REPAIR: Grow funds in order to help more students get out of education debt

SESSION: Embrace the pastoral transition by being spiritually led, more diverse, fully prepared to serve, living into individual gifts, connecting with and across ministries, and communicating openly and actively with congregants

TRUSTEES: Finalize and begin implementing a 3-year strategic plan to renovate major areas to include Fellowship Hall, main kitchen, public hallways, Sanctuary, and Courtyard

WORSHIP: Grow participation of diverse members including prospective/new members and full families in all aspects of worship
